In order to be considered for admission to the programs of Electrical Engineering or Computer Engineering, students must have earned a minimum 2.75 cumulative average in English 1010-1020, Chemistry 1110, Engineering Science 1510-1520, Electrical Engineering 2010-2020, Mathematics 1910-1920, 2120, and Physics 2110. Provisional status may be granted to students with a grade point average of 2.0-2.74. These students must then complete 12 credit hours of engineering courses (9 hours of which are specified in the department) with a minimum grade point average of 2.75.
